
Secret Message

Isaiah, Prophet to
Judah

BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- God called Isaiah to be a prophet.
- Isaiah knew his sin made him unworthy to be near God.
- God forgave Isaiah's sins and gave him a message for God's people.
- The prophet Isaiah told about the Messiah.

KEY PASSAGE: 2 Chronicles 7:14

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How did God plan to fix what sin broke? Before He created the world, God planned to send the Messiah to save sinners.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- Why was Isaiah scared to stand before God?
- Who is the Suffering Servant? How do we know?
- How did Jesus suffer for our sin?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

• Decorate your home to look like a fancy restaurant. Invite your family to wear formal clothing and wait on them as a servant might. Discuss how Jesus proved that He is the greatest servant, and suffered to take away our sins.








New and Better

 How did God plan to fix what sin broke? Before He created the world, God planned to send the Messiah to save sinners.


FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:








From Hate to Love

- Habakkuk learned to have faith and trust in God.

KEY PASSAGE: 2 Chronicles 7:14

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How did God plan to fix what sin broke? Before He created the world, God planned to send the Messiah to save sinners.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- Why is there still evil in the world?
- How can we trust God when we face difficult times or evil events?
- Who defeated evil once and for all?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

 Talk to your kids about evil in the world. Remind them that, although many difficult and bad things happen, God is ultimately in control. Encourage them to think of ways they can be part of God's good work in the world.

BIG PICTURE QUESTION:

 How did God plan to fix what sin broke? Before He created the world, God planned to send the Messiah to save sinners.

FAMILY DISCUSSION STARTERS:

- How is God loving to punish sin?
- Did God abandon His people when they were captured? Why or why not?
- Who took our punishment for us?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

 Organize a game of capture the flag with your family and any friends your kids want to invite over. Talk about how we are born as slaves to sin, but Jesus died to set us free from sin so that we can love and obey God.








Bone Bonanza
